Reinhart Active Core Fixed Income Composite contains fully discretionary, bundled and non-bundled, fee-paying, fixed income accounts over \$200,000 in assets under management that are managed using the Active Core Fixed Income strategy. Accounts falling below \$950,000, or two consecutive months, are removed from composite membership. (For periods prior to July 1, 2021, accounts included in the composite were over \$1 million in assets under management & accounts that fell below \$950,000 were removed from the composite.) The composite seeks to invest in investment grade, taxable, fixed income securities with an average maturity of 0-30 years.
